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Austin Dance India Celebrates 25 Years of Bharata Natyam Dance in Central Texas

Creative Director, Anuradha Naimpally, to showcase a sensational season of dance performances and student showcases throughout 2016

Austin, Texas (February, 2016)— Austin Dance India, Austin's preeminent performance company and school for Bharata Natyam dance, is celebrating its 25th year in 2016 with a dynamic calendar of live performances and student showcases. Under the creative direction of Anuradha Naimpally, Austin Dance India will present a season of spectacular dance events including a 10 x 10 student showcase, a free dance-a-thon, and a collaborative multi-disciplined performing arts production at The Long Center, *Living in the Hyphen*, directed by Leng Wong of Lucky Chaos Productions, choreographed by Naimpally and featuring an ensemble cast of local actors, musicians and ADI dancers. *Living in the Hyphen* runs from March 31st to April 1st and explores the quandaries people face as they straddle two worlds. Austin Dance India's programming is family friendly and strives to unite the Austin community through the inclusive and transformative power of dance.

What began in 1989 as a young, passionate dancer sharing her craft in a garage with a just a couple of students, Austin Dance India has evolved into an essential force in the Austin creative and dance communities. Ever-dedicated to her passion for dance and desire to teach, Anuradha Naimpally, founder and Creative Director of Austin Dance India, has been training dancers since the youthful age of 15 and continues to serve as a mentor, advocate and expert in the art of Bharata Natyam dance. Throughout her decades-long career as an award-winning performer and teacher, she has taught an estimated 50,000 classes to more than 1,000 students – many of whom she has mentored for 10 years or more. "I feel deeply blessed that I have been able to establish a tiny corner of Indian classical dance in Austin that expands wide for anyone interested to experience it," shares Naimpally. "Dance can and should be taught in a way that uplifts the spirit as the student discovers their own inner beauty and strength. I am still always discovering new wonders about the transformative powers of dance."

To celebrate this hallmark year for Austin Dance India, Naimpally has curated a deeply personal and exuberant programming calendar. The events kick off on Feb. 27th at the Asian American Cultural Center with the 10 x X Showcase – a student performance of works that are 10 minutes or less. Then, from March 31st to April 3rd, ADI will present a multi-arts showcase at The Long Center, Living In the Hyphen. In collaboration with Lucky Chaos Productions, this powerful presentation will combine theater, dance, music and comedy in an exploration of what it means to straddle two worlds – whether those worlds are cultural, artistic etc. In April, the community is invited to enjoy food, crafts and dancing galore at ADI's student Dance-a-Thon Community Fair hosted at the Asian American Cultural Center. The silver anniversary season wraps at Rollins Theater at The Long Center on Oct. 22nd with the popular Annual Student Showcase. This year's



show explores the theme of "Girl Power" and will feature performances from current students, as well as the many talented alumni of ADI from the past 25 years.
